PROGRAM DETAILS

June 20-July 29 from 8 a.m.-2:30 p.m.

Earn 1 science credit, .5 elective credit and up to \$600!

Seed to Table is a **hands-on learning experience** where students work and learn in the **kitchen, classroom, field, and wood shop**. This summer opportunity is part of the TEENworks teen employment program at the Goodman Community Center.

Students need to be prepared to be active and outside for part of every day. Students may experience uncomfortable working environments including heat, cold, rain, dirt, sun and insects. Students will be expected to wear closed toe shoes, long pants in kitchen and the provided uniform shirt and name tag. **Cell phones will not be allowed during class time.**

To earn full credit and receive full pay students cannot miss more than 3 days during the summer. Students with more than 3 absences will be dropped from the program. For students that successfully complete the program there will be opportunities for further employment. **Students must be 15 years of age or older and be able to obtain a work permit.**

Interested students should complete an application. Students will be interviewed and those selected for this opportunity will need to complete necessary paperwork. **There will be an informational meeting for parents of accepted students on June 15 at 5 p.m.**

SAMPLE CLASSES

Scientific Method

In the Scientific Method class, students learn about chemical reactions used in cooking and the importance of proper sanitation, measurements, and record keeping.

Urban Ecology

In Urban Ecology, students study the urban environment in outdoor settings like farms and fields, including water and nutrient cycles.
